

Protest Profile Project

Step #1 Choose a mid-century protest topic from the list below.

You may choose any of the following activist organizations:

- American Indian Movement (AIM)
- Anti-War Movement (against Vietnam War)
- Black Panthers
- Chicano Moratorium Committee
- Community Services Organization (CSO)
- Congress of Racial Equality (CORE)
- Japanese American Citizen League (JACL)
- La Raza Unida
- Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party (MFDP)
- National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP)
- National Indian Youth Council (NIYC)
- National Organization for Women (NOW)

Step #2: Choose HOW you will create your project. You can create your Protest Profile Project with any illustrative medium you prefer: Sway, Canva, Google Slides, etc. You can also make it by hand and submit a picture of it if you choose, but do not go out to get art supplies.

Step #3: **Begin your research.** Make sure to write down the FULL LINKS to all of your sources (ex. https://www.history.com/news/black-power-movement-civil-rights NOT just history.com/news/black-power-movement-civil-rights NOT sources at the end of your project.

Step #4: **Assemble the content for your project**. Here's what you want to make sure you include:

- 1. Name of the Activist Organization (Example: Black Panthers)
- 2. Names of the founders where this is applicable.
- 3. What did they protest for? What did they want to change?
- 4. Provide other basic historical information important to explaining why this group is important in the big picture of US History.
- 5. Include relevant images (at least 3).

Step #5: Create and refine your Protest Profile. Organize the required elements into a **dynamic design that captures the attention of your viewer and informs the reader**. YOU WILL NOT EARN CREDIT FOR COPY & PASTE PLAGIARISM. Be careful of copying your sources too closely. Put it in your own words. You can use quotes, but make sure to credit who said it and the link to the source at the end. You will earn credit for the content and creativity of your project.

Review the success criteria before submitting to make sure you earn full points. Also, look for the opportunity to earn extra credit.

Success Criteria	
Accurate information included; includes the following content 1. Name of the Activist Organization 2. Names of the founders (where applicable) 3. What did they protest for? What did they want to change? 4. Other basic historical information important to explain why this group is important in the big picture of US History 5. 3 or more relevant images	/ 70pts.
At least 3 relevant images provided in design; design is engaging and well organized	/ 20pts.
Sources included (full links, and no Wikipedia)	/ 10pts.
